
Small group instruction **is not a sustitution** of whole group instruction!





When is the **Whole group** instruction in Literacy recommended?

- Teach curriculum lessons.
- Exposure to new vocabulary.
- Exposure to grade-level texts.



When is the **Small group** instruction in Literacy recommended?

- Teach Foundational skills.
- Students grouped by needs / skills.
- Flexible grouping.


